EUROPEAN UNION INITIATES AND SUPPORTS COOPERATION OF PARTNERS FROM LITHUANIA, POLAND AND RUSSIA

The Lithuanian town Marjampole in collaboration with specialists from the Russian Chernyakhovsk established modern equipped library for families. In Polish town Węgorzewo already exists school sports center for disabled children, which also benefits the children from the Russian Oziorsk in Russia.

Municipalities of Sopot (Poland), Tolkmicko (Poland) and Mamonowo (Russia) together improves the protection of the Baltic Sea. The Lithuanian city Panemune and Russian Sovietsk build common bridge connection on the Neman river.

The Beneficiary from Russia - City Ambulance Station from Kaliningrad - together with its Partner - a hospital from Elbląg (Poland) - provided rebuilt of their premises and bought new modern ambulance cars.

All above projects are only the examples of 60 projects commonly implemented in the Lithuanian, Russian and Polish border areas under the Lithuania-Poland-Russia ENPI Cross-border Cooperation Programme 2007-2013. Each of them has European Union's (Lithuania, Poland) and Russian part of the investment. Together under the Programme they realize projects from many

What is Lithuania-Poland-Russia ENPI Cross-border Cooperation Programme 2007-2013?

The Lithuania-Poland-Russia European Neighbourhood and Partnership Instrument Cross-border Cooperation Programme 2007-2013 is co-financed by the European Union and Russian Federation. This European Programme aims at promoting economic and social development on both sides of the border between EU countries (Lithuania, Poland) and Russia, addressing common challenges and problems, promoting people to people co-operation.

Among them there are 53 regular and 7 Large Scale Projects. The grants of regular projects are usually not more than 4 M EUR, while the maximum grant of LSP ranges from 6,1 M EUR up to 10 M EUR.

The total budget of the Programme amount to 145 861 066,56 EUR, where 124 212 271,66 EUR is the European Union contribution and 21 648 794,90 EUR – the Russian Federation investment. The financing rate in the projects is up to 90% of eligible expenditure.

The Programme area includes various types of institutions and local authorities as well as non-governmental organizations who decided to submit their projects to be co-financed by the European Union and Russian Federation. The cross-border cooperation perspective attracted a huge number of applicants from Lithuania, Poland and Russia. They all have one goal – live improvement of their neighbors - inhabitants of the Programme area!
